

Dear CSW Harms,

It was discovered that you purchased two bicycle licenses for individuals. The first incident was approximately 2 months ago where a bicycle was found on railroad property. The bicycle was a better brand bicycle and a garage door opener was attached. The bicycle was found on the railroad property along with a bottle of liquor next to it. The individual did report to the PD and claimed her bicycle. In speaking with her she stated that she was staying at Marco Manor and did not have any money for a bike license. You felt sorry for the individual who was down and out on her luck and you purchased a bicycle license for the individual so if it would be lost again we would be able to contact her right away.

Another incident happened about a month ago where two boys came into the police department looking for a lost bicycle. You took their description of the bicycle and located one of the bicycles in the basement. Upon bringing up the bicycle and one of the boys identifying the bicycle as his, you stated to him that he needed to obtain a bicycle license for his bike. The boy indicated that he had no money and did not have any money at home to get to purchase a bicycle license either. Instead of holding the bicycle until he could obtain the money to get a bicycle license and return the bike back down to the storage area, you paid for a bicycle license for the boy.
