It is with continued pride that I present to you the 2010 Annual Report of the Manitowoc Fire Department. This document will display information about our department and the statistics for 2010.



The City Fire Department continues to look at ways to make ourselves more efficient (LEAN), transparent, and save money. Some examples are: the Union has worked outside their contract with the City fathers to save money whenever possible; a fuel savings policy was instituted; and we have switched to purchasing many of our daily supplies from Wal-Mart and the Dollar Store. We also continue to cross staff our vehicles which saves us from employing one additional firefighter per station, and we have joined several organizations and participate in group buying whenever possible.

2010 was a challenging year. We had an increased call volume and we had an arsonist operating in the area. The arsonist was caught and sentenced to jail. There were numerous undeterminable fires during the year, however when this person was arrested they stopped. A thank you goes out to our Fire Investigators and the Manitowoc Police Department for putting this person behind bars.

As the economy continues to decrease, we get busier. As you will see in 2010 our call volume is up and so is our dollar loss to fire. With less people having insurance and wanting to stay at home longer our EMS Division has gotten more "Help Up Calls" and No Transport/Assessment Only calls in 2010. This last year is also one of the first times we have seen local Emergency Rooms go on by-pass for either having no beds or not enough staff. As an all-hazard responder we must adapt to all different kinds of challenges.

As we continue to look into the future, it will be vital to remember the importance of having fire stations geographically spaced. The key to this is that fire doubles in size every minute. Fires that have been reported to us in a timely fashion, we have been able to save lives and property. Our daily staffing of firefighters is to fight a normal room and contents house fire not a large fire or an industrial fire. "We staff for the norm not the exception". We rely on our off duty firefighters to respond as well as our neighboring fire departments to help when called. Currently, we have a good working relationship with all fire departments in the county. The future may show a regional approach to provide fire service.

The personnel of the fire department are to be commended for their commitment to professionalism and service as they continue to excel not only in service, but also in willingness to make changes to better the way we deliver our services. As a department, we continue to strive to create and update our policies and procedures in an effort to provide an excellent service to our community.





# Staffing

The Manitowoc Fire Department is uniquely staffed. The type of staffing used at our outlying stations is called "Cross Staffing". This type of staffing requires staff to be assigned to 2 vehicles rather than one, and also reduces the number of on duty staff to one less Firefighter/Paramedic per shift per station. However, this kind of staffing only works when the call volume supports it.

There are currently 2 standards to look at when it comes to staffing of Fire Departments: MABAS and NFPA 1710. MABAS stands for Mutual Aid Box Alarm System. This is a State system that calls for additional help during large events. The system has determined the minimum number of people required on an apparatus needed to respond to a fire or significant incident. NFPA 1710 is a national standard that we use for benchmarks and it recommends the number of firefighters that should respond to a normal room and contents fire.

The Manitowoc Fire Department looks at two categories when we decided on our minimum staffing. We look at the EMS call volume, and what it takes to safely put out a room and contents fire. As you can see from the attached chart we are currently well below both standards. Our call volume continues to climb each year.

The Department Management Team continues to review staffing requirements to provide a safe yet lean department. We look at response times and call volumes. In a fire situation a fire will double in size every minute. In an Emergency Medical situation every minute counts when you are not breathing or bleeding profusely. The City is fortunate to have 4 fire stations. This gives us the ability to divide the city into 4 quadrants to provide a quick response. Our goal is to meet the national standard of a five minute response time for the first unit to report to a structures fire 90 percent of the time and the remaining units to be on scene within 9 minutes 90 percent of the time. We are able to meet this standard 90 percent of the time with 4 stations. Without the four stations there would be sections of the city that would fall below the national standard, as well as our Department standard and mission to provide for a quick response to those in need.

When you look at response times and Emergency Medical Services you will note the following crucial times:

1. Cardiac-Time is Muscle- This refers to the ability to diagnosis a heart attack and get that person to a cardiac center. The goal here is to diagnosis and open the blockage within 90 minutes of onset.
2. Trauma- The Golden Hour. This refers to getting a traumatized patient from the place of injury to a surgical suite within 60 minutes.
3. Stroke-The key to successful stroke management is to diagnosis and start to treat a stoke within 3 hours of when the symptoms started.

All of the care we give in EMS is determinant of proper diagnosis and rapid transport to an appropriate facility. If this is accomplished we can decrease death and disability. This, in essence increases the ability for the person to enjoy a long, happier, healthier life.

## Donations/Grants

The Manitowoc Fire Department relies on donations from local businesses to promote our Fire Education Program. One hundred percent of the money collected goes into our education fund to purchase educational materials. The Fire Department will visit every kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup> grade and 5<sup>th</sup> grade classroom every year promoting fire education and the Learn Not to Burn Campaign. Our department also takes community requests for all other forms of public education from fire extinguisher training to career fairs and education of the elderly.

The Office of Justice Assistant awarded our department with a 75/25 grant to purchase 6 Mobile and 15 Portable VHF radios. These radios are P-25 compliant and able to be used in multi-jurisdictional events.

The department was also awarded a \$10,000.00 Federal Assistant Program (FAP) Grant from the State to help with payment of EMS training and supplies. With our FAP Grant money the department has outfitted an ambulance to be a bariatric advanced life support ambulance. We are capable to handle patients up to 1,200 pounds. Without this unit we were safely able to handle patients up to 400 pounds. The new unit includes: a new stretcher, ramps, and a winch system.

The Fire Department was awarded a DNR grant for wildland firefighting equipment. We purchased wildland firefighting hose, wildland water backpacks, wildland helmets, and wildland coveralls.



## Manitowoc Fire Department EMS Division

The EMS Division is responsible for the coordination and operational readiness of the department's Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The EMS system is designed to meet the out-of-hospital emergency medical care needs of the citizens and visitors of Manitowoc in a timely and efficient manner. Manitowoc's EMS providers respond to all medical calls, motor vehicle accidents, and any medical needs that may arise. Activities performed by this division include implementing and monitoring pre-hospital care, continuous quality improvement programs, maintaining Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and Paramedic state licensing training and records, as well as updating and clarifying EMS policies and procedures. The EMS Division coordinates and completes state mandated training and provides recommendations and technical support for departmental EMS and fire related training. The Manitowoc Fire Department employs 8 EMT Basics and 46 Paramedics.

The personnel who provide the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in Manitowoc are the same personnel who fight fires, perform vehicle extrication, technical rescue, handle hazardous materials, and provide fire prevention/education. Every member of the department is qualified to provide the services mentioned above. If a fire call comes in, the personnel assigned to the stations respond in fire units leaving the ambulance behind. If the call is for EMS, those same people respond in the ambulance leaving behind the fire vehicle. The members of the Manitowoc Fire Department have shown that they have the highest regard for all patient care. Nearly every week the Fire Department receives a thank you or letter of appreciation from a patient. The members of the department represent some of the best trained personnel equipped with the latest equipment and supplies. However, the training and equipment are not what makes the members of the Manitowoc Fire Department great at what they do. The members of the Manitowoc Fire Department approach every call as though the patient is a family member. Along with performing their skills efficiently and professionally, Manitowoc Fire

Department members go out of their way to do the little things for the patients like ensuring their belongings are cared for, their pets are safe, and their homes are secure.






## Mode of Response






### Runs by Gender




### Squad Responses




**Call Volume Based on Time of Day**



**Call Type**





## 2010 EMS Call Volume

## Manitowoc Fire Department Hazardous Materials 2010 report

The Manitowoc Fire Department has 10 members on the Manitowoc County Hazardous Materials Team. The training and equipment is provided by the County, but stored and maintained by the fire department. This assures that the City of Manitowoc is well prepared to quickly and efficiently respond to any hazardous materials incidents that may occur in the City.

These members train monthly on various topics including; pesticides and herbicides, ammonia response, chlorine response, waterway spills, specialized equipment review and many other topics. The Hazmat members also are involved in 2 large exercises annually. One drill is with the nuclear power plants in the area, and the other is with various local industries which deal with extremely hazardous substances.

An example of a recent response was in September of 2010 when a large amount of lubricating oil was accidentally released into the storm sewer system from an industry on Dufek Drive. This product was pooled in a retention pond but needed to be contained and absorbed to prevent any additional contamination. Hazmat team members from the Manitowoc Fire Department worked with other City departments and local industry to quickly and safely mitigate the situation.

## 2010 Code Enforcement

The Manitowoc Fire Department is responsible to inspect all public buildings on an annual basis. This includes residences that have 3 or more living units in them. Currently we inspect approximately 1600 hundred buildings. This is for the initial inspection and does not include re-inspections. Approximately 40% of the buildings require some type of re-inspection to be in compliance with State and Local Codes.

We receive our authority from the Wisconsin Department of Commerce through Chapter 14 or more commonly known as Comm 14. This chapter adopts National Fire Protection Association 1 (NFPA 1). We also enforce local codes that can be found in Chapter 6, Fire Prevention, of the Municipal Code of the City of Manitowoc.

We did adopt a new ordinance in the summer of 2010 regarding fire sprinkler systems. We were finding that due to the bad economy, businesses were not having their sprinkler systems checked on an annual basis as required by code. This is a serious life safety issue as the sprinkler system is the first line of defense to protect lives and property when a fire occurs. The ordinance also requires that the companies and their employees present their credentials to show that they are licensed in Wisconsin and licensed to do the work. At first there was some confusion and anger from the businesses but as we met with them and educated them on the purpose of the ordinance the response has become positive. This ordinance also allowed us to prosecute and prevail against some business owners who shut down and drained their fire protection system because they felt it was not necessary. It is a vacant building that could jeopardize a whole city block if a fire should occur.

Due to changes at the State level, assisted living homes, foster homes and adult daycare facilities could no longer get their required annual fire inspection from the State. These businesses came to the Fire Department to see if we could help out. These types of facilities are explicitly exempt from our authority. Until the language gets changed, the State agency that licenses these facilities will accept the inspection from the fire department and the Department of Commerce will allow us to do so. We have stepped forward to inspect these businesses with no cost to them. It results in the facilities getting their required inspection and gives a chance to visit them and make sure that they are safe for the residents, employees, visitors, and rescue personnel should they be called.

2011 will provide even more changes as the Department of Commerce is being disbanded. The talk now is to move us into the Department of Regulation and Licensing. We will continue to provide professional and thorough inspections in the City of Manitowoc to make sure everyone stays safe.

## 2010 Annual Report

It is with great pride that I present the 2010 Annual Report for the Manitowoc Fire Departments Bureau of Fire Prevention. The Bureau is made up of Public Education, Code Enforcement, and Fire Investigation. 2010 proved to be a tough year as the number of fires near the end of the year increased with some of those being ruled arson by our Fire Investigative Team. It ended with a fire that consumed a building that housed a law firm and a dentist's office. The fire loss for this fire alone was over \$3 million. As we continue to deal with a struggling economy, we have seen that fires and code violations have increased. We created an ordinance that requires businesses with fire sprinklers to get a permit when the annual inspection was done. This helps us keep track who has a system and when it needs to be checked. This ordinance came to be because we found that as businesses were trying to save money, they stopped paying to have their systems checked on a quarterly and annual basis. This practice is extremely dangerous as this is the first line of defense to protect those in the building and the building itself. The permit also requires that those doing the work on the system provide their credentials to prove they are licensed to do the appropriate work. This has also paid off and has affected cities state-wide. In fall of 2010, JC Penny's was having work done on their system. While the system was being tested, the fire department received a false alarm from the building. We arrived on scene and met with the company working on the sprinkler system. Deputy Chief Kadow asked to see their credentials and he found that the company was not licensed in Wisconsin to do sprinkler work. The matter was turned over to Safety and Buildings at the Department of Commerce. It was found later that this company had a contract for all the JC Penny's stores in Wisconsin.

We have reached out to all our kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders as we do every year to bring them our fire safety message. Teaching them at an early age and re-enforcing them as they get older helps to prevent them from becoming a fire statistic. We also bring that message to any age group or organization that invites us to talk to them. Our Juvenile Fire Counselors also work with children who have caused injury and damage with fire or have become progressively aggressive with setting things on fire. This program is becoming more successful and 2010 proved to be the first years where we did not have any repeat offenders come to the program!

The numbers presented in this report are more than just that. They reflect a community that is dealing with a poor economy and represent people and businesses. History has shown that as the economy suffers, the amount of fires, code violations, and EMS calls go up. We need to be vigilant in how each department spends its budget, but we must also be aware of the ramifications of deep cuts and cutbacks. To hinder us from doing our job and carrying out our mission would be a detriment to this community which is not acceptable to this department and the citizens of this community.

As the type of incident suggests, we have the capability to respond to and handles almost any type of situation that comes our way. These numbers do not show that we have technical rescue capabilities when needed. We are trained for and respond to trench collapses, confined space rescues, and water/ice rescues. We also test the 109 private hydrants in the City to make sure they are operating properly.

### *Thunder on the Lakeshore*

The annual air show is a major event for the city and usually occurs on the first weekend of June. The Manitowoc Fire Department Deputy Chiefs are in charge of Incident Command for any type of EMS, fire, or crash/rescue incident. We are on site Friday evening, all day Saturday and on Sunday until the show is over. We use on and off duty members of our department along with members from the Two Rivers Fire Department and most of the surrounding Volunteer Fire Departments. We work closely with the FFA and the military to provide a safe place for the ten's of thousands of people who come to spend the day at the air show.

Planning starts about 8 months prior with the air show staff and the fire department puts about 120 hours into planning before we even step foot on airport grounds.

## 2010 Fire Investigation

Our Fire Investigation Bureau has been busy in 2010. Although the cause of some fires can be determined just by talking to witnesses or those on scene, many can not. It is up to our Investigators to determine the origin and cause of those fires. They also work with the Manitowoc Police Department Detective Bureau when evidence needs to be collected or there is concern of arson.

Of all the fires we had in 2010, twenty-six of them required the Shift Commander to request a fire investigator. We did have a period when we did have someone intentionally starting fires. At this time we are working with the detectives to solve approximately six fires that were ruled arson. One person was arrested and successfully prosecuted for arson involving a vehicle.

When the investigators determine the fire is not arson and can locate the origin, they call in and work with the insurance company's fire investigators to find the cause. If they think it arson they work with detectives along with insurance company investigators.

The total approximate fire loss for 2010 was \$4.059 million. This included a \$3 million loss at a business that housed a dentist's office and a lawyer's office. The remaining \$1 million was mainly due to house fires. This amount is concerning and through public education efforts we hope to see a dramatic decrease in 2011.

The fire department assigns two investigators to each shift. Our current Bureau includes:

We are one short and hope to fill the position in the Spring of 2011.

## 2010 Public Education

One of the more important and enjoyable jobs that we perform is presenting different fire and safety messages to a wide variety of age groups in Manitowoc County. We put on talks, open houses, fire extinguisher demonstrations, fire drills, and use the Survive-a-Live trailer and Fire Pup to present our message.

Here are some of our activities with the number of people served.

- Fire Extinguisher Training 373
- Fire Drills 1289
- PE talks and SAT 1964

We also host the Junior Leadership Group on an annual basis. These up and coming leaders spend the day seeing what it is like to work at the fire department. They spend time with paramedics going through an advanced life support ambulance, put on fire gear and do search and rescue for a missing person, and talk about the career path of a paramedic/firefighter.

Our annual open house occurs on a Saturday at the end of October which is Fire Prevention Month. We put on presentations, have displays for the adults, and hands-on firefighting skills for the kids. When the kids had their "training sheets" filled out they could hand them in for some prizes. Fire Pup is on hand for picture and autographs. This is a great time for us to show the public what we have to offer and why we do what we do. The 2010 open house was a great success and I need to take time to recognize our sponsors. Festival Foods and Piggly Wiggly donated the hot dogs, popcorn and soda. Lowe's and Menards, and the Manitowoc Café donated door prizes. The success of the open house could not have been accomplished without the gracious support from the community.
