MINUTES OF THE MANITOWOC CRIME PREVENTION COMMITTEE
MEETING
FOR APRIL 7, 2011

ROLL CALL: Sgt. REVIEW OF CPC MINUTES FROM MARCH 3, 2011. A motion was made by Dewane, seconded by Kleinfeldt to approve. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Wetenkamp and Behringer reviewed the account balances in the asset accounts, various transactions for the month of March and the money market transactions. A motion was made by Dewane, seconded by R. Kramer to approve. Motion carried.

REQUEST FOR PUBLIC INPUT: No public input.

TRIAD UPDATE: Jacobs updated the committee and guests on activities of the TRIAD Committee. A sub-committee has been formed to present PSA's on scams. Members will be doing searches for violations on handicap parking spots. Members of this committee will meet to update the McGruff list. Jacobs informed the committee of the guidelines for participation in this program.

RETAIL FINANCIAL CRIME PREVENTION TASK FORCE: A presentation on scams was completed with this group as well as information on NSF checks.

KOHL'S CAKE PRESENTATION WEDNESDAY, APRIL 13, 2011 AT 10:00 A.M: Jacobs stated the presentation would take place on April 13th which is the day that the largest staff is available. Members were invited to join the group for this presentation.

HIGH SCHOOL MEMBER'S UPDATE: The Roncalli High School representative stated that thefts of I-Pods and money were missing from the girl's locker room. Lutheran High School representative stated there were no unusual problems at the school.

CPC ACTIVITIES/PROJECT PROPOSAL SCAMS, PSA, PICTURE ID BADGE: Pictures for identifying badges will be scheduled for the month of May. Members of the committee composed PSA's on identity theft and recorded them for airing on local radio stations.

REVIEW ORF CRIME PREVENTION MONTHLY ACTIVITIES: Jacobs informed the group that Kristin Clark, former Assistant Attorney for the City of Manitowoc, requested information on the Crime Prevention Committee and DARE interaction with the local school district. She was impressed with the activities in Manitowoc and was interested in putting similar programs in her Michigan town. Jacobs thanked Dick Weber for all of his assistance with the Crime Prevention Committee. Jacobs also thanked the Kramers for their work with the door prizes for the CP Day. Jason Koenig will be a canine officer handling drug recognition. A chaplain program (volunteer program) has been initiated with the Police Department which will allow officers to participate in counseling. During the month of September the Rahr-West Museum will host the history of the Police and Fire Departments from 1870 to 1980.

SRO ACTIVITIES: Incidents by schools indicates Wilson Jr. High has the highest record for reportable incidents.
