

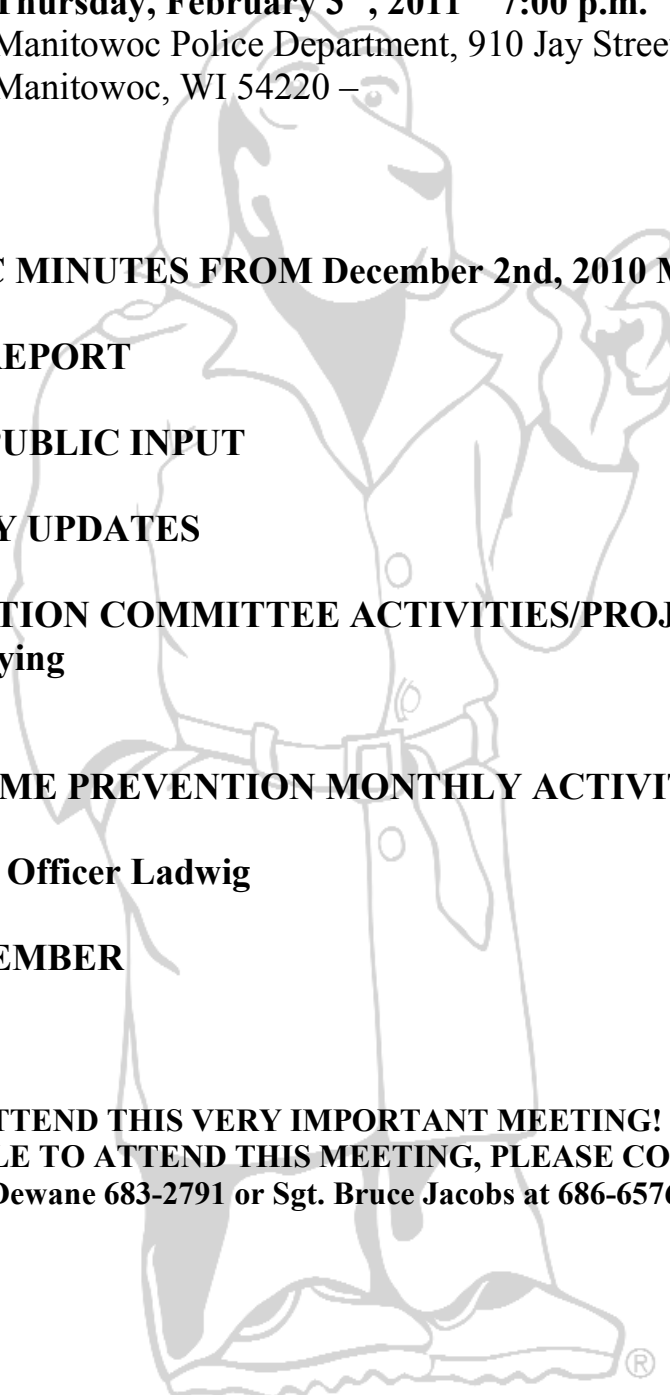

Manitowoc Crime Prevention Committee Meeting Minutes DECEMBER 02, 2010

Vice -Chairperson Ralph Kramer called the meeting to order at 7:00 p. m.

Behringer made the motion to accept Minutes. Scheinoha seconded. Motion carried.

Blahnik made motion to accept Treasurer's Report. Muench seconded. Motion carried.

There was no public input. Sgt. Jacobs explained that there will be another "Mock Robbery" Presentation to be given to Financial and Retail Crime Prevention Groups in the near future. It may contain a quick change operation, along with a "mock robbery." As done in the past, information packets will be distributed, observations made, and recalls to note accuracy will be discussed. Date and a central location to be determined.

Sgt. Jacobs introduced Melia Prange, from Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department. She gave a presentation about the drug, K2 Spice and/or Dancing Monkey, and the fact that it currently is a legal substance. State of Wisconsin is aware of how addictive this drug is and will be taking legal action to prohibit use of this drug in the near future.

Sgt. Jacobs also said that he plans to have Public Service Announcements on Anti-Bullying broadcast over WOMT Radio sometime in December. We also watched an August 2010 Video of a local grocery store incident, where a woman quick change artist attempted to confuse a clerk and obtain over \$20.00 cash. Luckily, the attempt failed!

SRO Activities included Craig Jansen from Lincoln High School. He spoke about incidents in school, such as, Sophomore peer pressure, challenging Special Education students, students not able to co-exist with parents, and fighting. He stated that the majority of the students are orderly and well -behaved, however, some students become repeat violators of school rules and policies.

Seeing no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m. HAPPY HOLIDAYS!
