## MARCH 4, 2010 MEETING MINUTES

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dewane at 7:06 p.m. in the lower training room of the Manitowoc Police Department.

**ROLL CALL:** Members Present: Linda Blahnik, Colin Chase, John Dewane, June Kramer, Ralph Kramer, Rebecca Hodous, Sgt. Bruce Jacobs, Kelly Peterson, Javier Saucedo, Lt. Paul Schermetzler, Gloria Wallace, Richard Weber and Vicki Wetenkamp.

Officers Present: Richard Ladwig.

Members excused: Carol Behringer, Keeley Crowley, Rita Muench, Steve Kleinfeldt Charles Rasmussen, Cooper Schmidt and Xia Vang.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** A motion was made by Blahnik, seconded by Peterson to approve the February 4, 2010 minutes as amended to correct a typographical error. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** The treasurer's report was presented by Wetenkamp which included the purchase of two lap top computers. The next financial report will reflect the actual balance in the DARE account. A total of \$23,404.11 reflected the account balances as of 2/28/2010. A motion was made by Sieracki, seconded by R. Kramer to approve the report. Motion carried.

**CRIME PREVENTION MEMBERSHIP MATTERS:** Jacobs updated the membership list on file with the City of Manitowoc Clerk's Office and informed the Committee that an application is being processed to fill the vacant position.

**REQUEST FOR PUBLIC INPUT:** President Dewane asked for public input. No members of the public were present.

**CRIME PREVENTION ACTIVITIES:** Sgt. Jacobs is in the process of reviewing the by-laws of the Crime Prevention Committee and a meeting is being set for a committee to recommend changes and/or clarification of existing rules. An election of officers will take place next month once the review is completed.

**REVIEW OF CRIME PREVENTION MONTHLY ACTIVITIES:** Sgt. Jacobs reviewed activities during the month which included teaching DARE groups at Cabrini and Stangel schools. The TRIAD group met at the end of February. Jacobs announced that the memorial for slain officer TenHaken will be completed by the April meeting and members of the Committee will have an opportunity to view it.

A motion was made by Blahnik, seconded by J. Kramer to have the Crime Prevention Committee donate \$100.00 towards this memorial. Motion carried.

**REVIEW OF CRIME PREVENTION MONTHLY ACTIVITIES:** Officer Ladwig, the School Resource Officer reported on activities which took place at Washington Junior High School, Franklin and Monroe elementary schools. Ten disorderly conduct, 9 truancy and 6 theft citations were issued. A sexual assault, drug possession and alcohol on school premises were included. Gang activity resulted in 5 suspensions for the beating of a student and graffiti being part of the gang involvement. There was a fight and a sexual harassment charged at one of the elementary schools. Ladwig will begin teaching DARE at three of the elementary schools.

Donkey basketball will take place on Friday, March 5<sup>th</sup> at Washington Jr. High School. Ladwig has set up a Facebook account and now has over 100 "Friends".

Sgt. Jacobs congratulated Rebecca Hodous (student member of the committee) for the newspaper article regarding her signing a letter of intent to play soccer with a University of Minnesota school.

There being no further business to address, a motion was made by R. Kramer, seconded by Peterson to adjourn. Motion carried and the Committee adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
