- 2) Minutes accepted.
- 3) No Public Input.
- 4) Treasure Report accepted. \$34,548.18
- 5) Membership Matters: We are getting a new Lincoln High School Representative to replace Norma Hernandez who had graduated in June.
- 6) TRIAD Update: Members helped with National Night Out. No meetings during the summer months.
- 7) Retail/Financial Crime Prevention Task Force Update: No meetings during the summer months.
- 8) High School Members Update: No Members present.
- 9) SRO Update: No SRO present. Lincoln High School has Miranda Check. Wilson Junior High has Paul Krock. Washington Junior High has Michael Laabs.
  
- 10) Citizen Academy Alumni Update: Applications are being prepared for the next academy. Members will be working at Showtime on Aug 12<sup>th</sup> and Aug 13<sup>th</sup> starting at 5pm. Free admission with entertainment. Tom Drill is MC, bands on stage, and Maritime Band plays on Aug 13<sup>th</sup>.
  
- 11) Manitowoc Community Youth Diversion Program: Participated with a booth at the Farmers Market the Acoustic Fest, and Pig to Pig. They will have a booth at Touch Twice and the Caveman Run. Last year's summer theme was awareness in our community, this year it is project freedom, a support for resources engaging youth struggling with issues. On Tuesdays from 4-5pm they have collaboration with the YMCA. They have a Smart Recovery Group for addictive behaviors. A 10 to 17 year old girls group for confidence building and less risk taking.

Latest scam was an elderly lady who sent \$9500 then \$15,000 to New York thinking her granddaughter was in trouble. The scam artist first had a female sound like the granddaughter then a male party acted like an officer. The money was sent as cash by Fed Ex. National Night Out had 7 members who went in two groups. Community Garden had a large turn out and N 9<sup>th</sup> St. More volunteers are coming forward wanting to be block captains for Neighborhood Watch. Committee agreed to keep getting involved in more events. School Open House was suggested with sex offender information along with drug recognition. A mini board was requested with Dave Remaker's information that he presented at TRIAD. An awareness along with a log started on needles being found in areas. It was reported a park worker was stabbed by a needle when collecting trash. Lifepoint= a business that will hand deliver a box no questions asked with box of syringes (100 or more), tourniquet, cotton balls, and other supplies needed for drug use with no questions asked. More Neighborhood Watch and Members of Community Drug Awareness on Facebook is needed to help with the growing drug problem. Amy Schoepp and Nancy Boeck volunteered to help create topics of information to attract attention at future functions.
